MD of the Year

Ami Milton, MD was awarded the RPACNY Physician of the Year award in May 2010. Dr. Milton is a graduate of the Pennsylvania State University College of Medicine in Hershey, PA and she completed her internship training in both Internal Medicine and Pediatrics at the North-eastern Ohio University Consortium in Akron, Ohio in 1992.

She finished her residency in Internal Medicine in 1994, and her fellowship in Rheumatology at SUNY College of Medicine at University Hospital in Syracuse, NY in 1996. She is also dually Board certified in Internal Medicine and Rheumatology. From 1996 until 2010, Dr. Milton worked in private practice Rheumatology and Internal Medicine for the Internist Associates of CNY, PC, in Syracuse NY, and is now employed in the practice of Rheumatology in Pennsylvania, having recently moved there at the end of May 2010.

Dr. Milton has served as a faculty member for SUNY College of Medicine, Syracuse, NY, and volunteered on the Arthritis Foundation Advisory Board, for the Syracuse Chapter. She has been significantly involved in multiple academic and clinical research projects, including being the principle investigator for numerous research endeavors.
